WEEKLY DRILLING PROGRESS REPORT FAIRWELL-1

Buru Energy Limited provides the following weekly update on drilling operations at the Fairwell-1 well as at 06:00 hrs, 10 June 2010 (AWST). Buru holds a 100% interest in this well.

Since the last progress report the Fairwell-1 well has been drilled ahead from a depth of 1,378m to a depth of 1,619m in the Laurel Formation. Slow drilling conditions have continued, however, a planned change to the drilling assembly should see increased penetration rates for the remainder of the hole.

The well is being drilled ahead to the second objective in the well, the Yellow Drum Formation. Re-correlation of the section using formations encountered to date has revised the prognosis for the top of the Yellow Drum section to approximately 1,675 metres drill depth. Depending on drill rate this section should be penetrated over the next two to three days after the planned bit trip and regular BOP test. The total depth of the well is also likely to be revised to approximately 1,900 metres.

Good gas shows were encountered in the Upper Laurel Shales as expected given their regional shale gas potential.

In accordance with its policy of releasing weekly drilling progress reports, the Company expects to issue a further drilling progress report on 17 June 2010, subject to any material events occurring in the meantime.
